Reproduction of archival material is subject to the copyright guidelines of the BC History of Nursing Society Archives and with the terms and conditions of the Canadian Copyright Act. Where possible, the BCHNS Archives holds copyright over materials under its control and custody. The Archivist at the BCHNS Archives will assist researchers with determining the copyright status/ownership of all materials (regardless of format) in its holdings. Researchers should be aware that while the BCHNS Archives is the copyright holder to the materials housed in its holdings, in some cases, copyright resides with the donor or with his/her estate. The Donor Agreement will be consulted to determine permission of use and all applicable restrictions. If copyright information cannot be determined, this does not imply that materials in the Archives are not subject to copyright. Copyright ownership and status is a highly complex area, the researcher is responsible for obtaining permission to publish and display any materials duplicated or photocopied from the Archives. Researchers should allow adequate time for researching ownership and obtaining permission to copy or publish. Permission to publish any materials in our holdings or make any use of materials must be requested in writing. The proper citation and acknowledgement to the BCHNS Archives must be given. Materials copied for the use of the researcher must not be recopied nor deposited in any other archive. The BCHNS Archives is required to keep a record of all requested materials.
